Summary	The following policy outlines the admission requirements and procedures for non-baccalaureate students.

Failure to follow the following policy may result in disciplinary action, including termination of employment.

Policy Statement:

Columbia International University seeks to make graduate-level training available to those individuals who do not possess a baccalaureate degree but whose professional and/or ministerial experience has prepared them for graduate education. Eligible programs may permit a maximum of 15% non-baccalaureate students; the total allotment is dependent on total enrolled students in a program, regardless of site, campus, or modality.

Rationale:

The policy provides clear and consistent directions, guidelines, responsibilities, and accountabilities to all colleges within Columbia International University for the admission and monitoring of all non-baccalaureate students. Consistent application of this policy ensures equitable treatment of students.

Policy Implementation/Procedures:

All Non-Baccalaureate students will meet the following requirements:

- Applicants must be 25 years of age or older by the application deadline and have completed a high school diploma or GED. (For the Master of Education in Chinese, an applicant must be at least 30 years of age and have earned a minimum of an Associate's Degree.)
- Application Fee (waived for Master of Education in Chinese)
- Church Leader or Professional Reference (depending on program requirements)
- Provide official transcripts as evidence of all high school, GED, and/or college work completed to date
 - Chinese Initiative applicants may provide a photo image or scanned copy of the following documents: an original high school diploma; or an original Household Registration Booklet (户口本) with the "educational background" section marked as "High School Graduate (高中毕业).

- Research Paper (guidelines, assessment, and approval to be determined by the appropriate Academic Committee)
- Applicants who are not United States citizens must also complete and meet the graduate application procedures for international students listed in the academic catalog.

Each eligible program permits a 15% capacity of non-baccalaureate students. The Admissions Office determines availability in the desired eligible program and will coordinate with the college-specific committee to determine the research paper criteria and then will communicate the criteria to the applicant. Once the research paper is submitted, it will be reviewed by the academic committee with commentary, final decision, and/or rewrite parameters to be communicated to the student by the Admissions Office.

Students who have applied or have been accepted and choose not to attend the desired term will forfeit their placement in the program and will be required to submit another application for a future desired term.

Non-baccalaureate students may change programs only if there is room for a non-baccalaureate student in the new desired program and no other prospective students currently in the admissions process are impeded from moving forward.
