The target threshold for success is a first-to-second year retention rate of at least 70%. CIU successfully achieved this threshold for ten of the past eleven years.

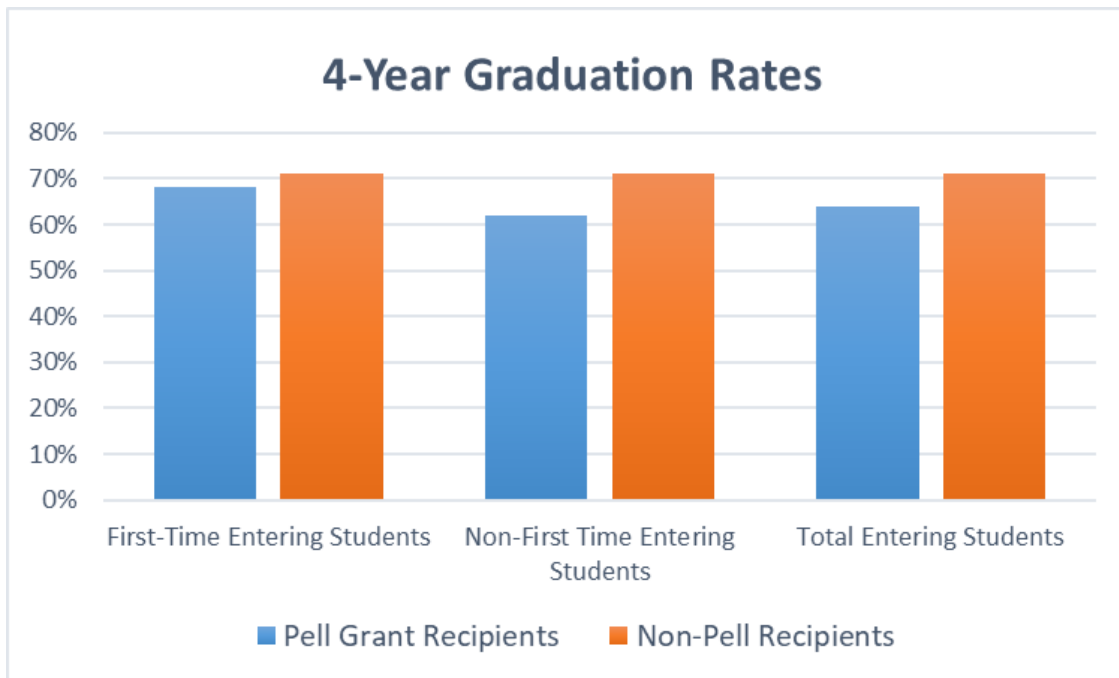

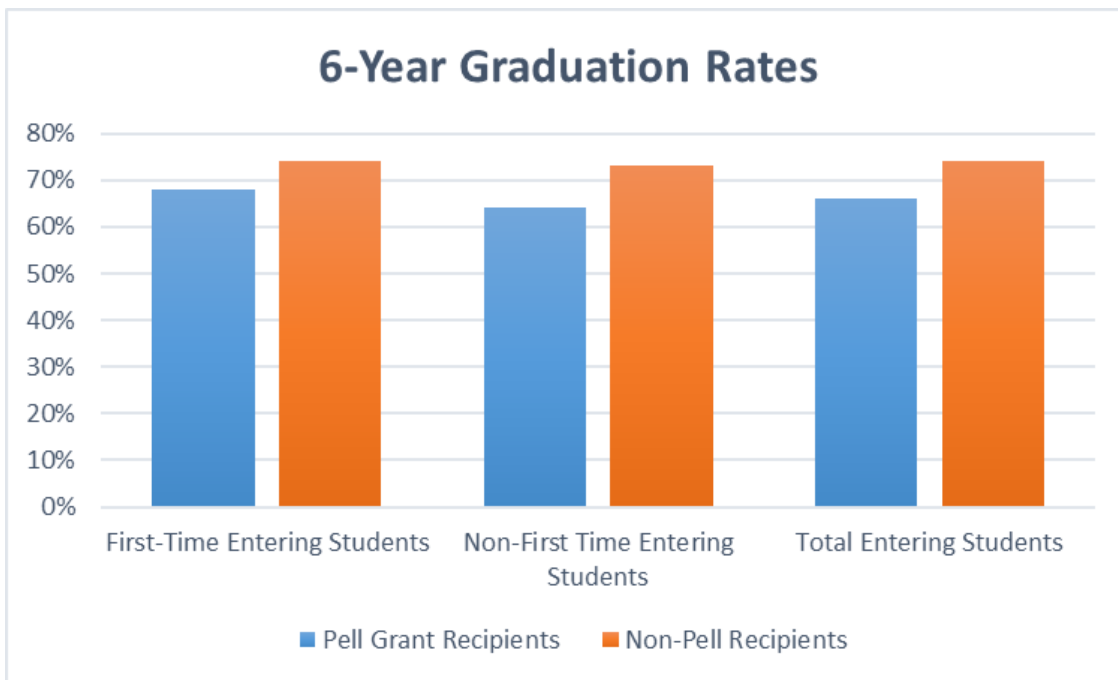

Did you know? In the 2017-18 Academic Year, the US Department of Education began to include the disaggregation of financial aid information in the IPEDS Outcomes Survey. Specifically, higher education institutions are required to report the 4-year, 6-year, and 8-year graduations rates for Pell recipients. The table and chart above and those that follow on the next page depict the data reported in CIU’s most recent Outcomes IPEDs Report. Reporting on the graduation rates for the Pell recipients serves as a measure of student success for low-income students.

National Data Comparison: The Pell data provides a mechanism for benchmarking against national data. Nationally, the non-profit, private colleges and universities reported a 6-year graduation rate of **64.8%** for all students in the 2011 Cohort. The 6-year rate for Pell students reported by the non-profit, private sector was **52.9%**. These rates compares to CIU’s rates of **71%** and **66%** respectively.
